Course Maintenance Tips

The course is in wonderful condition this summer, here are some tips for members to maintain the course.

Fixing a divot

Fill divot with sand from bottle and smooth until even with top of grass. Smoothing to grass level keeps the sand below mover blade depth, lessening the need to sharpen the blades of the fairway reel mowers. Throw your divot or another into the rough when time allows. The rough mower will chew these up.

Hole care

With the new rules allowing the pin to be left in the hole more damage around the edge of the hole is being seen. Be aware

not to damage the edge with your fingers when removing your ball, removing the pin if necessary. And never fish the ball from the cup with your putter head. Ball retrievers to fit the top of the putter grip are available for those with difficulty bending over.

Driving Range care

When hitting from the grass tees arrange your divots in rows leaving an inch or two between the rows rather than removing the grass in a large patch. This promotes faster recovery of the grass teeing area.



Rules Corner

The new Rules of Golf for 2019 have created lots of discussion this year. It has been fun learning and debating the changes and how they have affected the game.

One additional local the new rules allow is the "Root Rule"

Exposed Rocks or Tree Roots: If a player's ball lies in the General Area and on maintained grass, exposed rocks and tree roots are treated as ground under repair if they interfere with the intended path of the clubhead. Interference does not exist if they only interfere with the player's stance. Maintained grass is grass that is being regularly mown by fairway or rough mower.
